VCA hosted the Fall 2018 Campus Town Hall on October 9, 2018, from 2 pm - 4 pm. The event was held in Pauley Ballroom and was designed to provide administrative updates to campus managers and directors. The audience heard from Chancellor Carol Christ, VCA Marc Fisher, VCF Rosemarie Rae, AVC Facilities Services Sally McGarrahan, and Interim AVC-HR and CHRO Jo Mackness. Questions for the Chancellor were submitted in advance of the event and facilitated by Dan Mogulof from Public Affairs. At the conclusion of the program, the audience was able to ask questions of any speaker. The Chancellor was still in attendance at that point and fielded several of the questions.

The event was publicized through CalMessages to 700 managers and directors, staff organizations and communities of practice, and through personal networks. 565 RSVPs were received, of which 547 were "yes." The audience was estimated at 475 to 500 in attendance the day of the event.

A half-hour "information fair" was presented at the conclusion of the speakers' program. The fair consisted of tables and representatives from 13 campus units around the perimeter of the room. The majority of the audience departed at the conclusion of the program and did not visit the information tables, but those that did found them informative.

A survey was sent to participants to rate how valuable they found the Campus Town Hall. Respondents were asked to suggest speakers, topics, and format changes to improve future Town Hall meetings. Unlike last semester, the survey was anonymous. Sixty-five responses to the survey were received and most respondents submitted qualitative answers. The average score was 8.2 (out of 10) and the Net Promoter Score was 38 (scored from -100 to +100), both of which are strikingly similar to the spring 2018 Town Hall survey results (8.33 and 40).
